

TO ALL RANDOLPH RESIDENTS are you aware that over 1.5 million pounds of post consumer textile waste (USED CLOTHING) is NOT being recycled?

This costs the Town of Randolph approximately \$64,000 per year in dumping fees. With Randolph's population we could reclaim 300,000 pounds of textiles per year. Reclaiming 300,000 pounds per year would generate \$7,500 in revenue for our children. This would save the town approximately \$12,500 per year in dumping fees. Only 10 pounds per capita is being recycled. This translates to 8.75 billion pounds of post consumer textiles ending up in our landfills.

The Randolph Board of Health with the help of the Randolph High School now has a Recycle Trailer at the High School parking lot. We can finally clean out our closets, cellars and basements of all the old clothing. Not just old clothing but paired shoes, old bedding, table cloths, towels, ECT. ANYTHING made from cloth can be recycled. All these items can be bagged and dropped off at the Trailer in the High School parking lot. Please we do not accept books, electronics, board games, carpets, kitchen ware or trash.

Did you know that for the months of November & December we collected 2.32 tons of recyclables in the trailer? If we could get the word out to all our families and friends based on Randolph's population we could reclaim 300,000 pounds of textiles per year.

The Randolph Board of Health will donate \$50.00 per ton to our local youth groups. This could be Little League, a school program, ECT. but all profits will benefit our children.

So please help us get the word out there "Randolph Recycles"
